THE PASSING OF POLITICS.

The New York republican state platform indorses the separating of municipal from national and state politics, taking the very sensible ground that for city government politics are not needed, and that a non-partisan ticket is better calculated to furnish the city with good officers. This is no doubt true. If polities were left out of the question, and the right was conceded by all parties to their members to vote regardless of politics in city elections, better city governments would be the result. There would be less rings, less corruption, and such societies as Tammany would lose their power. The individual voters could and would then meet on the common ground of a common interest. Political prejudices would be laid aside, and the property owners and tax payers would be able to have something to say concerning the city government.
