THE NICARAGUA CANAL.

The Nicaragua canal is one of the principal subjects of discussion just now, and indeed gives promise of becoming an issue of the next political campaign.

The exploration of the route was made by Commodore Lull, and is said to show a practicable route, with lake Nicaragua as its summit level, 107 feet above the sea.

One of the principal difficulties will be in maintaining a sufficient depth of water at Greytown, the Atlantic terminus of the canal.
