## AN IMMENSE ROCKING STONE.

**The Strange Discovery of Two Strolling Englishmen in the Scilly Isles.**  
 An interesting discovery has been made in the Isles of Scilly. The famous logan, or logging stone, within a mile or two of the Land's End, has been one of the sights of West Cornwall for many years, and thousands of tourists have, under the direction of the local guides, been able with a slight exertion to set the heavy mass of granite in motion, so evenly is it poised. But the logan rock is put entirely in the shade, says a late London dispatch, by the discovery at Peninnis, St. Mary's, Scilly, of what is believed to be the largest logging stone in Britain. Its existence was disclosed quite by accident. Edward McDonald and a friend were strolling around Peninnis when a squall of wind and rain came on, and they sought shelter by the side of an enormous mass of rock. While leaning against it Mr. McDonald fancied he felt the rock vibrate, and an examination was made with the result that the two young men found that by their combined strength the mass could easily be made to move. Some time was spent by them in proving their discovery and measurements were taken. The rock is pyramidal in shape and of the following dimensions: Mean breadth, 11 feet; length, 19 feet; height, 21 feet; circumference, 55 feet; and 68 feet over all. It contains 4,380 cubic feet, and is estimated to weigh about 250 tons. It has since been visited by a large number of persons who have confirmed the discovery. It is remarkably well balanced and can be put in motion by one person, the momentum continuing after the power has been withdrawn. It has been called the McDonald logging stone. A similar but much smaller rock was found in the same vicinity by Thomas Simmons while he was in search of the new logging stone. It is flat on top and can be logged by two or three persons sitting on the top, see-saw fashion. It is estimated to weigh 100 tons.

## A GOOD LESSON.

**Respect for the Court Taught an Applicant for Citizenship.**  
 Judge Ferris is a man who believes in maintaining the dignity of the courts. While he does not use his position to be captious about it, yet he never fails to impress on a person who displays a lack of respect for the court and through it the law, that the court must be respected and its dignity maintained.  
 An instance how a man can be taught that respect for the courts means respect for the law was given by Judge Ferris. The person referred to was an applicant for citizenship. He went to court dressed as if he had left a cow stable, where he had been cleaning the stalls. His clothes were dirty and his boots were covered with filth. When the judge had looked him over he asked if he realized he was in a court of justice and was an applicant for one of the greatest privileges that could be granted him. The man hurriedly answered. The judge called his attention to the condition of his clothes and boots, and told him to go home and get on the best clothes he had, just as if he was to be married, and, if he passed the examination when he returned he would be given papers of citizenship. The man returned in a few days, well dressed, and showed by his manner that the lesson had not been lost on him. He had a wholesome respect for the court, and was, no doubt, impressed with the majesty of the law.
