COMPARATIVE PRICES OF ANIMALS USED FOR FOOD.

A study of prices in a great market is interesting and useful to producer and consumer. Present market quotations for cattle, hogs and sheep at the Union Stock yards, Chicago, suggest some useful lessons as well as some things hard to satisfactorily explain.

The variation in prices for cattle shows a wonderful difference, owing to quality. The highest price in the report at hand is \$6.40. Few sell at this price, or even at any price, within a dollar of this.

The variation in prices for hogs is much less than that for cattle. Excluding culls, the greatest difference in price in report at hand is 70 cents per 100 pounds.

A FOOLISH CONTEST.

The republicans in congress have noticed those candidates who were defeated for a seat in that body, and who are desirous of contesting the election of their opponents, that they must rely upon the justice of their individual causes, and not upon the overwhelming republican majority.

The verdict in the case of "Bunco" Kelley, tried in Multnomah county for the murder of George Sayres, is not proving satisfactory to the public. Indeed there is no reason why it should.
