A Natural Gas Experiment.

ANDERSON, Ind., Dec. 18.—The Indianapolis gas trust began a new experiment in natural gas production yesterday, on the Waddell farm, nine miles east of Noblesville. Twelve gas wells will be drilled on a section of land. Near the center a well will be sent down into salt water. To this well a powerful pump will be attached and the water drawn out. This will be done with a view of keeping the other wells dry. The experiment on a large scale is the result of one made a short time since by Superintendent Shackleton, when he put a pump into a wet well, and in less than forty-five minutes had a half dozen wet wells in the vicinity flowing dry gas. Many gas companies and citizens were present to learn the result.

SUMMONS.

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Wasco County.

To J. T. Delk and Sarah E.
