### The Body Positively Identified.

PANA, Ill., Dec. 19.—The boy who was murdered here Saturday has been identified as Arthur L. Binnion of Vernon, Ill. His father is here, and the body will be brought back from Chicago. John Binnion of Vernon positively identified the clothing found on the murdered boy as those of his son, Arthur L. Binnion. He went into hysterics when told of the initials "A. L. B." tattooed on the arm. A telegram was sent to Chicago to stop the interment of the remains taken there by William Barbour, who had claimed them as those of his son, who, however, turned up alive and well today. The police have no clue as to the murderer.

### Waite and the Cowboys Censured

MONTICELLO, Utah, Dec. 19.—When Colonel Lawton, of General McCook's staff, and Indian Agent Day, arrived here from Denver to investigate the reported invasion and threatened outbreak of the Utes, from Colorado, they had no difficulty in persuading Chief Ignacio to obey the orders to return to the Colorado reservation. Colonel Lawton says there was never any cause for alarm, and that the actions of Governor West were not warranted by the situation, as the Indians were peaceable all the time. He also blames the cowboys. The Ute chief is much incensed against the "Mormon Liars."

### Somebody Else's Body.

CHICAGO, Dec. 19.—George H. Barbour, a young insurance clerk, supposed to have been murdered at Pana, Ill., walked into the morgue today, where half a dozen of his associates were gathered to identify his body. Barbour's father was present, and an affecting scene followed. The body of the young man found buried near the railroad track at Pana had been fully identified by the father as that of his son. Young Barbour refused to say anything regarding his disappearance Thanksgiving day.

### Will Give Us Another Chance.

LONDON, Dec. 19.—Secretary Grant, or the Royal Yacht Squadron, stated today it had been decided to give the New York Yacht Club another chance, and the only conditions upon which the race will be sailed for the America's cup has been cabled the New York Club. He refused to disclose the conditions.

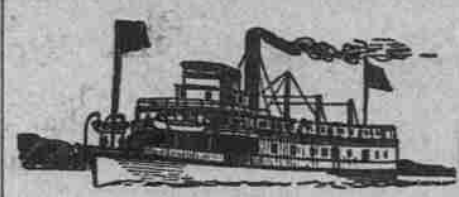
