In the House.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—At least 20 members of the house crowded into the area in front of the speaker's rostrum today in an effort to secure the passage by unanimous consent of bills of local importance, but English of New Jersey, who has inaugurated a war of retaliation against unanimous consent legislation until a measure of his is passed, was on guard and obdurate. However, he allowed a joint resolution, offered by Livingston of Georgia, providing for the entrance of foreign exhibits to the cotton states' international exposition at Atlanta next year, to go through.

"This bill, I understand, involves the admission of contract labor," suggested Wilson of Washington, humorously. "I want to remind the gentleman that but a short time ago he was in a furor over the admission of a single coachman. Does this bill provide for the admission of English coachmen?"

"It does not," replied Livingston, amid laughter.

English also allowed the senate bill amending the act creating the court of appeals of the District of Columbia, to pass. English finally demanded the regular order.

A joint resolution, providing for a holiday recess from Saturday, December 22, to Thursday, January 3, was adopted. The house then, on Springer's motion, went into committee of the whole for further consideration of the currency bill.

Hamilton of West Virginia was recognized by the chairman, but before he could proceed, Johnson of Indiana arose for the purpose, he stated, of propounding an inquiry to the chairman of the banking committee.

"I understand," said he, "at a meeting of the democratic members of the banking committee last night it was decided to offer a substitute to the pending measure, and the consent of the secretary was secured. In my information correct? If so, I would suggest the substitute be now offered in order that we can proceed intelligently."

"Some time during the afternoon," replied Springer, "I will say it is my intention to introduce a substitute for the pending bill."

Springer, however, denied the consent of the secretary of the treasury had been asked for or obtained. The democratic members of the committee were responsible for the substitute.

Sir Charles Tupper Ill.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—Canadian Commissioner Tupper has been ailing since his recent attack of influenza. Tuesday he was seized with a chill, and is now unable to leave the house. Owing to the condition of his health, Sir Charles will not accompany the body of Thompson to Canada on the cruiser Blenheim. Senator Sanford alone will sail with the remains.

Rioting in Peru.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—Special dispatches from Lima, Peru, say a riot of the most serious nature has occurred at Lima. President Caracases, it appears, ordered a crowd of hungry men and women, accompanied by many children, to disperse. A riot occurred, which lasted three hours, during which many people were killed and injured.
