India Levies More Duties.

CALCUTTA, Dec. 28.—The legislative council has passed bills amending the acts of 1894 by adding cotton yarns and fabrics to the list of imported articles dutiable at 5 per cent, and levying a 5 per cent excise duty upon goods manufactured in India.

The Tong-Haks Suppressed.

LONDON, Dec. 28.—A dispatch to the Times from Shanghai says that the Japanese, after four hours' fighting December 23d, with a force of 6,000 Tong-Haks, suppressed the rebellion at Hal-Chin, in the province of Whang Hai-do, where the rebels had deposed the governor and installed one of their number in his place. The Japanese have also dispersed the Tong-Haks, who held the Korean garrison at Chullado.

CITY OF MEXICO, Dec. 28.—The Guatemalan envoy was received today by President Diaz, attended by all the ministers and principal generals. The minister's speech was pacific. President Diaz, in replying, said:

"Your visit will be pleasing in any event, but it will be still more so if it put an end to the state of alarm existing between Mexico and Guatemala."
