French Expedition in Congo.

PARIS, Jan. 2.—The minister of the colonies is said to have received a cablegram stating the natives had attacked the French expeditions in the Congo country, killing 18.

The statement that one advance of the French expeditions in the Congo country had been attacked by the natives, is confirmed, but reinforcements arrived at the post and retaliated upon the natives destroying several of their villages and killing 100.

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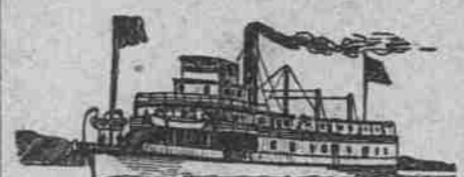
