WRONG IN PRINCIPLE.

One of the lessons learned by the business collapse of 1893 is that the bonds given by sheriffs and other financially responsible public servants must be carefully scrutinized and properly drawn up if they are to insure the county from loss through the dishonesty or inefficiency of the principals.

We have always thought that the system of placing public officials under bonds was a wrong one. It is wrong in principle, and a failure in practice.

We believe the system entirely and unqualifiedly wrong. We believe that no bonds should be required, but that in case of misfeasance or malfeasance in office the law should punish the offender himself.

Let the law recognize the fact that the criminal is the one to punish, instead of his friends, and see to it that he is punished, and there would be no necessity for making one or two citizens of the county become guarantors that the majority of the voters of the county had not made fools of themselves in electing their officers.
