THE TRUE ANARCHISTS.

There is no explaining why both the United States courts and congress manage always to find some way in which to give the public domain to corporations. The recent action of the court of appeals at San Francisco, in deciding that the Oregon & California Railway Company had earned 300,000 acres of land near Forest Grove, modestly estimated to be worth \$1,000,000, but probably worth \$5,000,000, is one of these inexplicable cases.

The anarchists of this country who will eventually cause a terrible upheaval are not the Johann Mosts, the Fieldings, the Spies, the Lings. They are the Huntingtons, the Crockers, the congress and the United States courts. With these and such as these lurks the danger to our institutions.

Senator Smith of Wasco and Sherman counties has introduced a sensible bill,

which would settle the question of making the Columbia river available as a means of getting the products of the eastern portion of the state to market. It is short and to the point, simply providing that when switches are put in at Celilo and The Dalles, the O. R. & N. shall furnish cars and haul them between the points named for stated prices.

It is now claimed that the anti-Dolph legislators are going to attempt to block all legislation. As it seems quite probable that the railroad commission and its fellows are to be continued, it is perhaps the most creditable thing that faction has yet done.

A Proper Bill.

The following resolution was introduced in the Washington legislature, and it should not only pass that body, but should be indorsed by our own.

WHEREAS, The low price of farm products necessitates their delivery at points of exchange or sale, at the lowest possible price for freight charges; and

WHEREAS, The Columbia river, if unobstructed, would furnish a cheap and effective means of transportation to a large portion of the state of Washington, which is now at the mercy of railroad transportation lines; and

WHEREAS, The United States government has adopted the recommendations of a board of engineers appointed to report on the same, in favor of a ship railway to overcome the obstructions at the dalles or Tumwater falls of the Columbia river, and an appropriation has been made to begin such improvements; and

WHEREAS, Experience has demonstrated that more efficient and speedy work results from contract work than from work under government charge; and

WHEREAS, The interests of the state demand an early completion of such improvements at the dalles or tumwater falls of the Columbia river, in order that such improvements may be operated in connection with the canal and locks at the cascades of the Columbia river; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the house of representatives of the state of Washington, the senate concurring, That the senators and representatives of the state of Washington, in the congress of the United States, use every means in their power to secure the placing of the construction of such improvements under contract; and be it further

Resolved, That the secretary of state of the state of Washington be and is hereby instructed to furnish a copy of this resolution to each of the United States senators and representatives of said state.
