La Gascogne is Safe.

FIRE ISLAND, Feb. 11.—4:15 p. m.—There are three steamers off Forge lifesaving station. One is a French steamer moving slowly. Will not reach Fire Island for two hours.

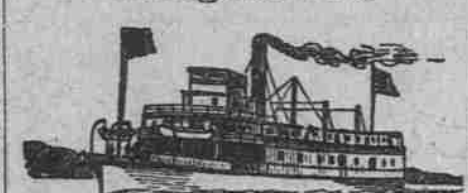
