AT MIDNIGHT FRIDAY.

As nearly all the papers in the sta give Saturday as the time fixed for th adjournment of the legislature, while few fix the end of the session at minight Friday, we have been asked state the correct time. The law pr vides that the legislature shall meet of the second Monday in January, an may set forty days, drawing pay fe that time. It may continue twen days longer without pay. The session beginning on the 14th would have eigh een days in January, and would ther fore close at midnight of the 22d of Fe

The 22d day of February is a leg holiday, but is not a non-judicial da so that, without bringing in the question of the legislature's right otherwise hold a session on that day, it would l legal for it to do so under the provision of the law. The session will, therefor terminate at midnight day-after-tomo row. Friday. It is quite probable the the adjournment will not take place up til some time Saturday, in order the bills may be signed and the business the session properly wound up.
