OUR NEW SENATOR.

The long agony is over, the legislature has adjourned, and ex-Secretary of State George W. McBride is elected United States senator to succeed Hon. J. N. Dolph.

George Washington McBride is a native son of Oregon, having been born in Yamhill county in 1854. He is a son of Dr. James McBride, who was well known as one of the earliest and sturdiest pioneers of this state.

Mr. McBride comes from an old and very well-known Oregon family. He has several brothers, who have achieved leading positions in the law and in medicine.

Mr. McBride's early purpose to become a lawyer, and with that end in view, after leaving school, he entered the law office of Judge J. C. Moreland of this city.
