DENVER, Colo., March 14 .- The coroner's jury in the Italian lynching case have returned a verdict stating that the lynching was done by persons unknown. The Italian consul at Denver sent a communication to Governor McIntyre yesterday calling his attention to the fact that two Italians were taken from the jail at Walsenburg and lynched, and also stating that several other Italians in jail there, the consul was informed, were threathened with a similar fate, and called on the governor to protect them.
