Lynched By Unknown Persons.

DENVER, Colo., March 14.—The coroner's jury in the Italian lynching case has returned a verdict stating that the lynching was done by persons unknown. The Italian consul at Denver sent a communication to Governor McIntyre yesterday calling his attention to the fact that two Italians were taken from the jail at Walsenburg and lynched, and also stating that several other Italians in jail there, the consul was informed, were threatened with a similar fate, and called on the governor to protect them. The governor replied by saying he had called on the sheriff at Walsenburg for information in regard to the lynching, and had instructed him to protect prisoners. He also said he would take such further steps as were necessary to protect the life and property of Italians in custody. The governor adds that he has not yet been informed as to whether the Italians are or not American citizens.

The citizens generally censure the shooting of the prisoners. It is not known whether any Italians who were lynched were American citizens. Italians here do not retaliate, though the feeling among them is intense.
