MANITOBA'S DEFIANCE.

Affairs in Manitoba are rapidly approaching a state of open rebellion on the part of four-fifths of the population against the authority of the dominion and of the queen in the regulation of its local affairs.

It is the first firm stand that has been taken in any province for the principle of home rule in local government where-in it has been carried to the point of resistance to the veto power of the dominion and of the mother country.

MAUDLIN SENTIMENT.

The Pendleton Tribune waxes indignant over the manner in which Blanck, the Seattle desperado, was "murdered."
