Thurston's Note to Gresham

WASHINGTON, March 27 .- The notification sent by Minister Thurston to the state department of his intentions to leave the country and designating Secretary Hastings as charge d'affairs of Hawaii, was received by the department here. Mr. Hastings will be recognized as Hawaii's diplomatic representative until notice of the selection of a new minister is received.

It is understood Thurston's formal note to Gresham announcing his intended departure from Washington, which reached the secretary today, is brief almost to the point of curtness. It simply stated that he intended to depart for Honolulu this afternoon, leaving Secretary Hastings in charge of the Hawaiian legation. The note is said by those familiar with diplomatic communications of its class to be remarkable for its omission of customary courteous explanations and absolutely unique in failing to announce whether his government had or had not given him leave of ab-


