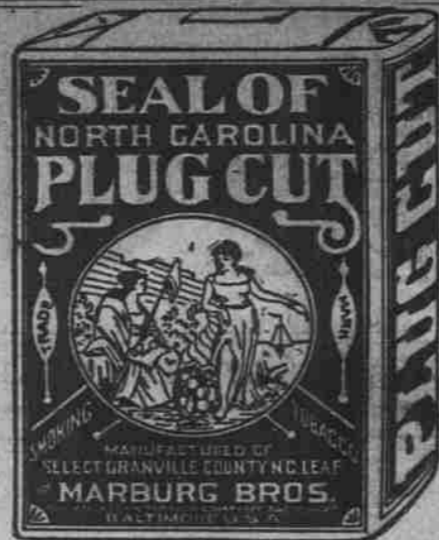
At Mrs. Belatt's place on Chinoweth creek, Saturday May 4th, Fred Klimpt, aged about 25 years.
