It is reported that English investors are beginning to buy American securities again, through J. P. Morgan & Co., of the bond-buying syndicate. English capitalists must buy something or go without the interest they love so well, and they have probably discovered the fact that there is a much smaller loss upon investments in the United States. upon investments in the United States than in any other part of the world. When American corporations began to go into receivers' hands, after the de-structive crash in Argentina and Ausstructive crash in Argentina and Australia, the English investors looked for the same results here, and hastened to sell. Since then they have sunk enormous sums in Africa, where they took their money next, and now they discover that the American securities they sent home are beginning to be worth more than they sold them for. Naturally they are inclined to reinvest. If we had sense enough to put our finances we had sense enough to put our finances on a sound basis, we could get plenty of money from Europe.-Oregonian.
