For more than a hundred years our supreme court has been looked upon by the entire civilized world as the most independent, the most upright and the most perfect judicial body in the world. The recent decision besmirches that grand reputation. It is not that the decision was against the income tax that does this, but the manner in which that decision was reached. It will be remembered that Justice Shiras, at the first trial of the case, was in favor of the constitutionality of the tax, but upon the second hearing of the matter, when it was certain that Justice Jackson would throw the weight of his opinion in favor of the law. Justice Shiras suddenly reversed himself, thus making the court five to four against the law, instead of five to four in favor of it, as the decision would have been had he stood by his expressed convictions. Uncharitable people; people who are acquainted with the ways of politicians, people who know how the great aggregations of wealth accomplish their purposes, will find but one explanation of Justice Shira's sudden flop, and that is undue influence exerted in such a manmer as to increase Justice Shiras' income. 


