

Remove the Thistles.

THE DALLES, June 3, 1895. To THE EDITOR—In a few weeks the thistle will be in blossom, and then the seed time will come; and what then?

What can be done to prevent this? How put a stop to the extension of the tract of country now occupied by the thistle? Simply obey the law.

Section 9, 10 and 11 of city ordinance No. 274 refers to this matter and provides that property owners shall not permit thistles to bloom nor exist on their premises nor abutting streets or alleys.

The penalty for any violation of this ordinance is a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars or imprisonment in the city jail.

Now is the time to begin and by a little work save a vast amount of trouble. The street commissioner is charged with the duty of seeing that the provisions of the ordinance are enforced and should look well to the matter.

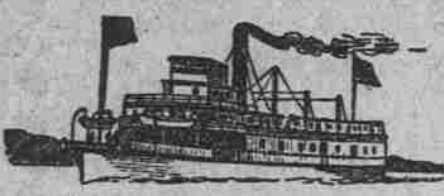
