The Republicans in Convention Assembled.

THE ILLINOIS DEMOCRATS MEET.

A Free Silver Platform Probable—A Statue For the Late Secretary Gresham.

In Memory of Gresham.

CHICAGO, June 5.—Sculptor R. H. Parks, of this city, is to make a bronze bust or statue of Walter Q. Gresham. Relatives and friends of the dead secretary have decided to preserve his features and form them in bronze, but whether it will be mere bust or a full-length statue has not been determined. The chances are the memorial will take the form of a statue. This movement has grown out of the desire to have in permanent form a tribute to the memory of a man whose integrity and attainments contributed a grand page to national history. To gain one of the most important means to this end it is necessary that the facial representation of the late secretary should be perfect in every detail. In order to get the measurements necessary for a work of this kind, Mr. Parks and a representative of the Gresham family, commissioned by Otto Gresham, to take charge of the matter, paid a visit to the tomb of the secretary in Oakwood cemetery. The casket was opened and Sculptor Parks directed the movements of an expert, who with a delicate set of instruments, took an accurate outline of the secretary's face and head. Mr. Parks then verified the measurement and made a sort of geometrical draft on the design.

ILLINOIS DEMOCRATS.

Many Delegates Attending the State Convention at Springfield.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., June 5.—With every train today came large delegations to the democratic state convention. More people came than any one expected, and the streets are thronged with silverites. Blue badges bearing the inscription "Free Silver, 16 to 1," fluttered from the coast lapels of incomers, and many delegations carried banners proclaiming a belief in free coinage.

The delegations that came in yesterday and last night were up almost with the sun this morning, and silver speeches by enthusiastic believers in free coinage could be heard in lobbies at all hotels. Every delegate seemed to be for the free coinage of silver, and if there were any opposed to it they were so quiet as not to be noticeable. There is no doubt that a radical free-silver platform will be adopted and the democratic party of this state be committed to that policy.

Kentucky State Convention.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., June 5.—Republicans of Kentucky are holding the largest state convention today in the history of their party. The delegates and workers for W. O. Bradley, for governor, and other candidates, today claim they are converging as the majority party. They attribute this revolution to the negro question being no longer an issue and the lines being drawn on the tariff and silver questions. It is thought some republicans will vote for free silver and free trade, but more democrats will vote against these two planks.

While there is no opposition to Bradley for governor, there are eight candidates for second place, and about as many aspirants for each of the other places on the ticket. The Bradley slate went through in all seven congressional district meetings, assuring the adoption of the gold standard and protection planks.

Firemen's Tourney at Walla Walla.

WALLA WALLA, June 5.—The Eastern Oregon & Washington Firemen's Association, a branch of the Oregon State Firemen's Association which has recently organized, is holding a three days' tourney at Walla Walla. Tomorrow is the last day, when the members will give an exhibition hook and ladder contest, a fireman's footrace and a championship race. Yesterday and today election of officers and general business filled up the time.

The Old, Old Story.
New York, June 5.—The World this morning says: Rumors are current that there is trouble between Jim Corbett and his wife, and that she has begun proceedings for a divorce. Mrs. Corbett's father, Mr. Lake, when seen last night, said that he thought the papers in the case had already been served on the pugilist. He would not state the cause of the trouble between his daughter and her husband. Mrs. Corbett was seen and refused to say whether or not she intended to sue for divorce.

"I have nothing to say—not a word. I will neither deny nor affirm the truth of the report," she declared. Corbett was not in the city and could not be seen. His manager, William A. Brady, refused to discuss the matter.
