

WASHINGTON LETTER.

From our regular correspondent. WASHINGTON, June 7, 1895. Had Mr. Cleveland tried he could hardly have selected a secretary of state who would have been more displeasing to the democratic leaders in congress than Attorney General Olney.

There is more or less dissatisfaction among democrats over Mr. Cleveland's method of selecting Attorney General Olney for Secretary of state.

The convention of the republican national league, which will assemble at Cleveland, Ohio, on the 16th inst., is regarded by most republicans as a virtual opening of the presidential campaign.

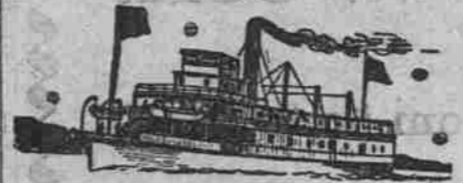
