zen; that while it is a governvient of enumerated powers, it has within the
limits of those powers all the stributes limits of those powers all the attributes
of sovereignty; that to it is committed power over inter-state commerceand the transmission of the mail; that the
powers thus conferred are not dormant, but have been assumed and pot into practical exercise by the legislation of
congress; that in the exercise of these powers it is competent for the nation to natural or artificial, to the paseage of interstate commerce or the carrying of ent for the government to forcoibly ret
move all such obstructions, it is equaliy within its competency to appeal to the civil courts for an inquiry and determin any slleged obstructions, and if any such are found to exist, or threaten to occur to invoke the powers of those courts the conrts conld not enjoin the commis sion of the acts complained of and Debs a contempt in disobeying the court' order.
