A Write Up of the Press Association by a Chronicle Representative—All Have a Good Time.

NEWPORT, OR.

TO THE EDITOR:—The Press Association left Portland on Saturday at 8:30, a. m., via east side to Albany. At this point the delegation was reinforced by the members of Southern Oregon, leaving Albany at 1:15, and after a most delightful trip, the excursionists arrived at Yaquina City at 5:30, and were met by the Second regiment band and a large delegation of citizens. From Yaquina City to Newport, across the bay, the distance is 3 1/2 miles. The tug boat Volanta, connects with trains and at 5 o'clock p. m. we arrived at our destination—Newport. The Dalles delegation have quarters at the Ocean House.

The clambake on the beach last Sunday was a great success, not less than two thousand people being present. J. W. Malcolm of the Hotel Portland having charge of the same. Sunday morning and afternoon the steamship Farallon took excursionists out over the bar, and it is said that a more generous lot of "Faber showers" never met before, they insisted in giving up all they had, even their breakfast.

The ninth annual convention of the Oregon Press Association adjourned this p. m., after a very pleasant and enjoyable session. The meeting was called to order Saturday evening by President Jno. R. Beagle, of the St. Helens Mist, who stated the only matter that would come before the meeting that evening would be an address by Senator John H. Mitchell. The senator was introduced and delivered an interesting address to the citizens of Newport and the visiting scribes. At the conclusion of the address, the Corvallis Quartette Club favored the audience with a selection, after which the meeting adjourned until Monday morning at 9 o'clock.

Monday—Meeting called to order by President Beagle, who introduced Rev. Thompson of Corvallis and the convention was opened with prayer. The Corvallis Quartette again favored the association with a selection. The names of a number of applicants were then read and elected members of the association. The president then announced the following standing committees:

Mr. Bensell, of Newport was then introduced and welcomed the members of the press to Newport and Lincoln county, assuring them that the homes of the citizen were open to the association; that the hinges of the city jail were broken and that the police were instructed to keep mum when in the presence of any member of the association. President Beagle then delivered his annual address. He reviewed the work of the association for the past year and offered many valuable suggestions to the craft. He felt confident that the press of Oregon was in a better condition than at our last annual meeting.

On motion convention adjourned until 1:30 p. m.

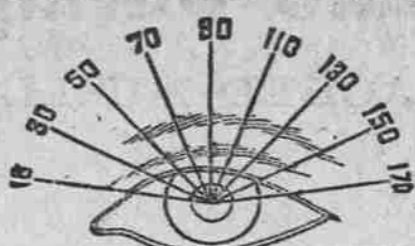

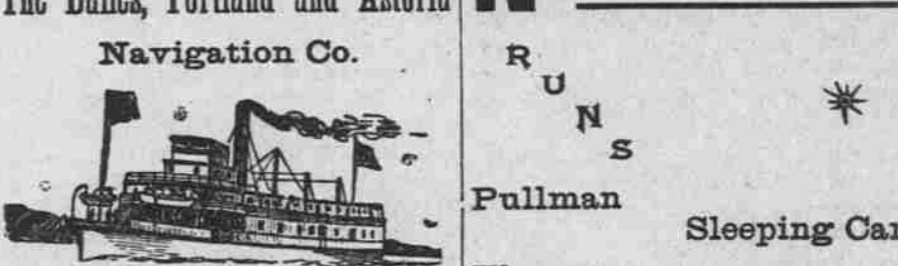
