LATEST REVOLUTIONARY WAR.

A SUIT ON BEHALF OF THE INDIANS.

An injunction suit has been instituted by the United States on behalf of the Yakima Indians against the Winans Bros., to determine the rights of the Indians to fish from lands owned by individuals.

It appears that the United States is not satisfied with that decision and will try the question anew; there has long been a controversy concerning these fisheries and if the courts can determine the question once for all, it will be a satisfaction to all concerned.

It is none too early to make plans for a Christmas celebration at the Cascade Locks. The Dalles is most deeply interested and should take the initiative.

Senator Dolph's criticism of the supreme court was not for the purpose of trying his case in the newspapers, but to enlighten the bar of the state of a new ruling.

If there has been any massacre in Jackson's Hole the United States troops will reach there in time for the funeral, possibly. But the chances are that the only funerals will be over dead Indians unjustly and uselessly killed by men who will never be punished therefor.

The prospect is favorable for a very large tomato crop in this county this year. If our canneries can't catch fish and don't like the canning of horses, they can secure any quantity of tomatoes, as well as other fruits and vegetables. The local market alone is quite

considerable for canned goods and we hope the local canneries will supply it. It will keep a very considerable amount of money in our own community, which otherwise would go to California and elsewhere.

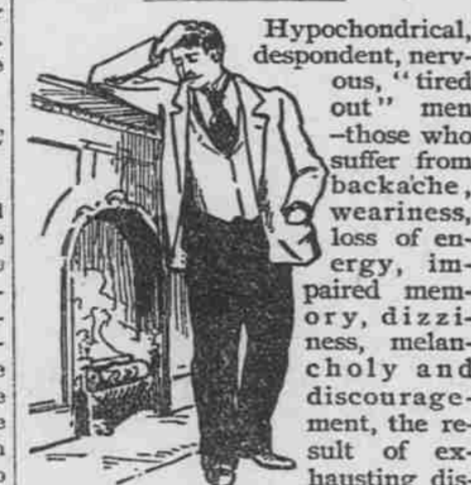
