SALOONS TO CLOSE AT MIDNIGHT The Council Orders Such an Ordinanc to Be Drawn--Pull Report of the Meeting Saturday Night.

The meeting of the city council Saturday night was unusually interesting. The fact that petitions would be presented, looking towards closing the saloons, had attracted interested spectators. When the roll was called Mayor Meneice and Councilmen Hood, Nolan, Saltmarshe, Ross, Johns and Thompson were found present. Mesers. Crowe, Eshelman and Wood came in shortly after, making the entire council present. Several petitions signed by a large number of citizens were read looking towards the closing of the saloons and the subject provoked warm debate. Mr. Nolan moved that the matter be referred to the committee on health and police and that the council would go into caucus and informally discuss the question. Mr. Saltmarshe seconded the motion. committee report Friday night. After quite a lengthy discussion the question was put by the mayor and the motion declared lost. Mr. Hood then moved that the recorder be instructed to draw an ordinance requiring all saloons to close at midnight. After a second by Johns the question was put before the council. Some good speeches were made pro and con. Every member of the council declared himself either on one side or the other. When the vote was called five councilmen voted in favor of the motion and four against it and the recorder was instructed to prepare the ordinance.

After the reading and approval of the previous minutes a petition from C. W. read and placed on file.

The committees on health and police and public streets made verbal reports. flesh of domestic animals is immediate Mr. Hood from the select committee appointed to interview the commission. reported that the commission would carry an open account with the city for water rent and not present the bill until the future state of our finances would permit.
