Settling a Chilean Claim.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—The Herald's correspondent in Sucre, Bolivia, telegraphs that a meeting of the cabinet was held to consider the treaty settling the claim of Chile in regard to the boundary question. Only the minister of foreign affairs, Senor Ichisal, voted for the treaty as proposed, the other four ministers voting in the negative and vigorously opposing the measure. President Batista was silent, but after the meeting said:
"I do, as president, accept, approve and will sustain the treaty. I will also take the responsibility of sending it to congress for ratification."

It is said that President Batista has secured enough votes in the senate to sustain his action, but he fears some of the deputies are not to be trusted.

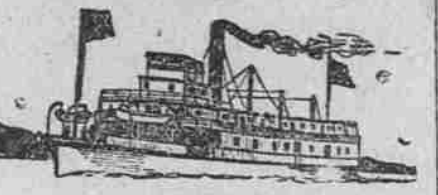
