| PORTE WILL REFISE <br> Gunboats May Not Enter the Bosphorus. <br> REASONS FOR THIS ACTION <br> Under Iresent Conditions tive Efrect <br> Mistat ise Disastrous--Meniden, gaired. <br> Cosstantinople. Nov. 24., via Eofia, <br> Nov. 25.-The main question now being discussed between the porte and repreeentatives of the powers is the demand of Great Britain, Italy, Russia and Austria for firmins for passage through the Dardanelles of an extra gunboat to be attached to tneir reapective embassies. While admitting that the powers possess the right to have two guard ships each in the Bosphorup, the porte considers that the proposed increase of the number of foreggn war vessels there under present conditions, might excite the Musaulmans and produce an effect far from the one desired by the powers. In addition the porte pointe out that in view of the measures taken to preserve order there, an iucrease in the number of guard ships attached to the embassies is not required. It can be said upon gocd anthority that this is the substance of the note the porte has sent the representatives of the powers. <br> As soon as the notes shall bave been received and considered at the British, Russia, Italian and Austrian embassies a conference of the representatives of those powers will be called and a joint reply may be sent the porte. Turkish reprepentatives at London, St. Petersburg. Rome and Vienna will be instructed to earnestly request the fonr powera not to insiat on their demand. <br> In political circles the repugnance of the porte to grant the firmins applied for contributes to the belief said to exist among the Turkish ministers that to grant the firmins would be a sad blow to the dignity of the eultan and a direct proof of the lack of confidence upon the part of the powers in bis ability to govern and maintain order.
