A new church organization is being contemplated in The Dalles. For a long time some members of the United Brethren faith have been desirous of having a church of that denomination in the city and steps have been taken looking to that end. A meeting has been held at which it was decided to make an attempt to form a church and have services more or less regularly for a time. A week from next Sunday preaching services will be held in the courthouse. There are a good many members of the United Brethren denomination in The Dalles and vicinity and it is believed the organization can be formed without any great trouble.
