All Christians in the City Closed Their Shops and Houses and Prepared to Defend Themselves.

CONSTANTINOPLE, via Sofia, Dec. 13 .-There was a disturbance in Stamboul today, and it caused the spread of rumors so alarming that Galata and Pera were soon in a state of panic, and serious outbreaks were threatened. This in view of the passage through the Dardanelles of the British gunboat Dryad and the Italian gunboat Archimeade, as extra guardships for the British and Italian embassies, formed the basis for a report that the rioting predicted by the Yildiz Kiosk courtiers had actually commenced, but happily the trouble was not serious, although the Armenians, as usual, are accused of having attempted to bring about an uprising.
