### Death of Father Mesplie.

Many people in The Dalles will remember Father Mesplie, for many years a resident of The Dalles. His death occurred in Grass Valley, California, November 20th. Father Mesplie, the well-known fruit raiser, whose farm is on Mill Creek. Father Mesplie was a well-known figure in the early pioneer history and his death will be noted wherever the early history of the Northwest is known. In the following sketch of his life, which is taken from the Monitor, it is stated that he came to The Dalles in 1856. This is a mistake, for he was known to have been here in 1851 and '52 and possibly earlier.

Rev. Father Mesplie, who died at Grass Valley, Calif., on the 20th of last month, was one of the pioneer missionaries among the Indians on the Pacific coast. Father Mesplie was born in France on the 25th of May, 1824. He received his education at Carcassone, France. In 1846 at the solicitation of Right Rev. Bishop Blanchard of Oregon, Father Mesplie and several others left France for the purpose of doing missionary work among the Indians of Oregon. He first labored among the Chinooks. In 1856 he was sent to The Dalles, and founded there the mission of St. Peter. Here Father Mesplie labored among the Wierama, Wasco, Umatilla, Cayuse, Wallula and other tribes until the year 1863. When the great mining excitement broke out in that year in Idaho Father Mesplie, in company with two Indians, left The Dalles and arrived at what is now Boise City. Here he labored with marked success, and soon established many churches and converts throughout the country.

When the Modoc war broke out President Grant appointed Father Mesplie and DeSmet to settle the difficulty existing among the Modocs. So successful were their efforts that President Grant appointed Father Mesplie chaplain of the army stationed at Fort Boise, Idaho. Here he remained until he was retired on account of old age. Father Mesplie is the author of the book "Thirty-five Years Missionary Labor in the Rocky Mountains," now printed in Paris. The funeral took place on the 22nd ult. Requiescat in pace.


