The last congress, however, in its blundering way, repealed the reciprocity feature of the McKinley law along with the rest. In doing so it placed this country before the world as one without continuity for foreign policy, for treaties recently entered into were abrogated by this congressional action. Our disagreeable relations with Germany, for instance, were caused largely by the sudden abrogation of the reciprocity treaty with that country, the result of the sugar schedule placed in the Wilson-Gorman law at the insolent behest of the sugar trust.
