**Marriages During the Year.**

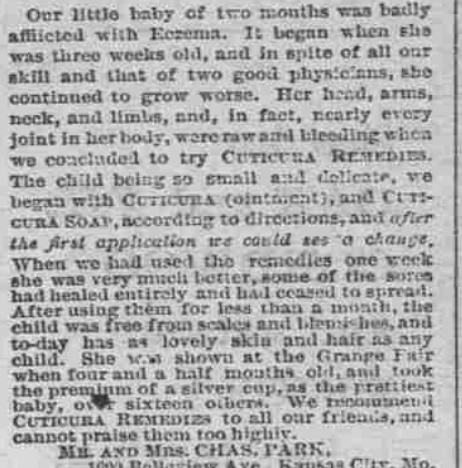

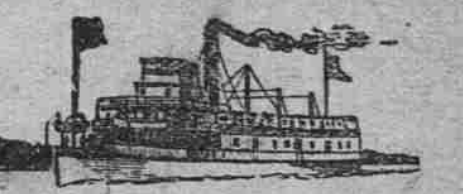
