THE DALLES PUBLIC BUILDING.

Below is published the bill which Senotor Mitchell has introduced for a public building at The Dalles. While the measure is not likely to become a law, its provisions are of interest. It is entitled:

A bill for the erection of a public building for a postoffice and United States land office at the city of The Dalles, Oregon.

Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the United States of America in congress assembled,

That the secretary of the treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and di-

rected to acquire, by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise, a site, and cause to be erected thereon a suitable building, including fireproof vaults, heating and ventilating apparatus, elevators, and approaches, for the use and accommodation atus, elevators, and approaches, complete, not to exceed the sum of \$100,000, which said sum of \$100,000 is hereby apmoneys in the United States treasury seems an assured success. not otherwise appropriated.

Proposals for the sale of land suitable for said site shall be invited by public advertisement in one or more of the newspapers of said city, of largest circu-

Proposals made in response to said admailed to the secretary of treasury, who shall then cause the said proposed sites, by an agent of the treasury department, who shall make written report to said secretary or the results of said examination, and of his recommendation thereon, and the reasons therefor, which shall be accompanied by the original proposals' and all maps, plats, and statements which shall bave come into his possession relating to the said proposed sites.

shall be or remain the owner thereof, for all purposes except the administration of the criminal laws of said state and the service of civil process therein.

After the said site shall have been paid for and the sketch plans and detailed estimates for the building shall have been prepared by the supervising architect and approved by the secretary of the treasury, the secretary of the interior and the postmaster-general, the balance of said appropriation shall be available for the erection and completion of the building, including fireproof vaults, heating and ventilating apparatus, elevators, and approaches. The building shall be unexposed to danger from fire by an open space of at least forty feet on each side, including streets and alleys.
