At 10:15 Tuesday morning the convention was called to order at the New Park theater by President Beekman. The four delegates from the first congressional district placed in nomination were R. A. Booth, of Josephine county; I. L. Patterson, of Marion county; J. H. Hawley, of Polk county, and J. A. Blundell, of Douglas county. This election was made unanimous.

Judge J. C. Moreland had a surprise in store for the delegates of the second congressional district, for no sooner had the president announced that nominations would be in order, than he sprang to his feet and began reeling off a list of candidates. The men nominated by Mr. Moreland were John Michell of Wasco county; J. M. Church of Union county; W. C. Avery of Multnomah county, and F. J. Taylor of Clatsop county. A good-natuted laugh broke out among the delegates as Moreland finished his list, and then some one promptly proposed that the nominations be closed. There was a little op-


