**Aluminum Diamonds.**  
It is well known to jewelers that aluminum will mark a glass or "paste" diamond, but not the true gem, provided the surface is wet. This fact has now been applied in the production of a mechanical tester, which consists of a small disk of aluminum rapidly revolved by an electric motor. The stone to be tested is wetted and held against the edge of the disk by means of a spring clamp. When metallic marks are found on the stone after this treatment it is rejected as false.
