PULPITS AND PEWS.

M. E. CHURCH.

The morning subject at the M. E. church was "Spotted Religion." Mr. Wood began his discourse with the statement that man is a religious being naturally and if he is not it is because of some injury committed by himself. Pure religion is hard to attain. There are spots on all chronicled religions. There were on the religion of the Israelites. Of the Pharisees, as godly a people as can be found in the new testament, inasmuch as they were zealous and prayerful and dispensed wide charities, Christ said that if the religion of his followers was not better than the Pharisees, they could not enter the kingdom of Heaven. Spots were found upon the seven churches, Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamos, etc., with the exception of Philadelphia, of which, no comment was made. The Christian religion was harder to live up to because it was a religion of being as well as doing. All that is necessary to be a good Buddhist or Mohammedan was to comply with certain forms and outward ceremonies. The Christian precepts are to be good, "be ye pure," "blessed are the pure in heart." John Wanamaker and J. D. Rockefeller were quoted as examples of devoted Christian men being successful in business affairs.
