### AMBULANCE ON WATER.

Steam Launch Added to the London Hospital Service.

The managers of the Metropolitan asylums board, London, have just passed upon plans for an ambulance launch for river service. Her dimensions, says the Philadelphia Record, are as follows: Length between perpendiculars, 60 feet; breadth, 12 feet 6 inches; depth, four feet; draught of water when fully equipped, two feet eight inches. The hull is built of Siemens-Martin mild steel throughout to board of trade requirements for passenger certificate. She is built in five compartments. In the fore part of the vessel is a cabin for the accommodation of the staff and for visitors proceeding to visit patients in the hospital ships in Long Reach, Dartford, and is capable of accommodating about 20 persons. In the after part there is a cabin fitted up as a hospital, with four berths—two being fixed and two portable—and with all the necessary requirements for carrying four recumbent patients. Both of these cabins are heated with steam and are provided with suitable skylights and all the necessary fittings for a boat of its class.

The machinery is fixed amidships and is of the triple-expansion type, with surface condenser, and capable of driving the vessel at a speed of ten knots. A water-tight trimming tank is built at the fore end of the vessel of sufficient capacity that when filled with water it will bring the vessel to an even keel of two feet eight inches.
