#### Water Commissioners' Regular Meeting

The regular meeting of the water commissioners occurred last evening. A full board was present. These were T. A. Ward, president, Robt. Mays, J. T. Peters, H. C. Neilsen, J. O. Mack, J. B. Crossen and H. Chrisman.  
Meeting called to order by president, T. A. Ward. The reading of previous minutes were read and approved.  
On motion the following bills were read and ordered paid:  
Mays & Crowe, supplies..... \$ 7 30  
I. J. Norman, salary..... 75 00  
W. S. Norman, helper..... 55 00  
H. Chrisman, secretary..... 5 00  
Maier & Benton, supplies..... 2 60  
C. J. Crandall, exchange..... 17 35  
The superintendent's report was read and accepted, showing a total book account of \$1,456.60; amount collected \$902.45; delinquent \$554.15.  
Application of J. J. Eoff for superintendent of Dalles water works read and on motion placed on file.  
Motion that L. J. Norman be elected superintendent from July 1, 1895, to July 1, 1897. Carried unanimously.  
Superintendent reported that he had seen Sinnott & Fish and A. Buchler, and stated that they would be satisfied to pay \$20 per month for 360,000 gallons or less, and if they use over that are to pay ten cents per thousand gallons extra. Motion carried that the report be accepted.  
On motion the superintendent was authorized to have notices printed and posted in regard to irrigating, setting forth that those below the bluff may irrigate on even days and above the bluff on odd days of the month.  
Adjourned.
