Terrible Destruction Caused by Wind in Ohio.

Trees and Bulldings in Its Path Swept Away-Several Villages Almost Annihilated.

After smashing the road bridge and blowing a big tree across a Wheeling & Lake Erie freight train, which crushed the caboose and came near killing a number of trainmen, the wind began to play havoc with farm buildings. The house of James Greene was destroyed. Greene's aged father, Wm. L. Greene, was killed outright, his wife was fatally hurt, and the baby carried across the road in its cradle. The child escaped uninjured. Next the barn of Amos Harrick, in which Harrick and John Low were shearing sheep was crushed. Low was blown across the field against a tree, being instantly killed.

At Booktown, a hamlet near here, nearly all the buildings were destroyed, but there was no loss of life. The storm covered a wide tract and it is possible that further damage was done.
