FOREIGN WOOL.

Eastern Oregon, as the greatest sheep raising section in the United States, is deeply interested in the rise and fall of the wool market. The conditions that prevail at Bos ton, or at any of the great wool centers, affect the weal or woe of the growers in the West. The outlook for the coming season can hardly be called bright. A large portion of last season's clip remains unused in the eastern warehouses, and the demand is light.

The only phase of the woolen industry which is thriving is foreign importation; the bringing of wool and woolen goods to this country goes merrily on, aided by the fostering care of the Wilson bill. The result is as satisfactory in England as it is not so here, as this comment from Messrs. Helmuch Schwartz & Co., a large London concern plainly shows:
