DES MOINES, Ia., May 25 .- Twentythree people are reported dead as a result of the cyclone which swept over the northern part of Polk county last night at Il o'clock.

The towns afflicted are Bondurant, Valleria, Santiago and Ira. No telephone, or telegraphic communication has been established except with Bonboard. The storm is said to have swept line. along the line of the Great Western from Bondurant to Marshalltown.

MARSHALLTOWN, Ia., May 25 .- A cyclone last night along the Chicago & Great Western railway, in Jasper county, killed probably 25 people. It injured more than that number.

The property loss is over \$100,000. Several miles of railroad track were practically destroyed.
