WASHINGTON, June 6 .- The conferees on the sundry civil appropriation bill agreed today on a partial report. The item appropriating \$179,189 for the opening of the canal at the cascades of the Columbia river will be compromised so as to provide that the work authorized shall be continued as proposed by the senate and not completed as was contemplated by the house bill.

The provision for the survey of the public lands was also compromised, the figure being fixed at \$325,000.
