In March, 1895, Spain sent to Cuba \$500,000; in April, \$400,000; in May \$1,521,000; in June, \$1,800,000; in July \$700,000; in August, \$1,600,000; in September, \$1,400,000; in October, \$700,-000; in November, \$1,700,000; in December, \$4,000,000: in January, 1896, \$2,000,000; in February, \$3,000,000; a total of \$19,321,000.

From March, 1895, to April 10, 1896, Spain had sent to Cuba 40 generals, 562 chiefs, 4768 captains and lieutenants, 3396 sub-lieutenants, 112,560 corporals and soldiers, 143 cannon, 50,111 rifles, 500 bayonets, 23,124 cases of canister shot, 61,878,368 cartriges, and 72,326 kilograms of powder. These figures are taken from El Liberal, one of the first newspapers of Madrid.
