

**The County Poor.**

Some of the inmates of the county poor house have very readily adopted the belief that the world owes them a living and are unwilling to do the least thing requiring physical exertion, however trivial. As a consequence they are becoming lazy and their ambition has reached such a low ebb that they are needlessly useless and are fastening upon themselves a habit which will grow upon them—that of laziness. Their inaction is not conducive, either, to their physical well being, and attention having been brought to the county court, the court has issued a decree, invested with proper safeguards for the protection of the inmate in all cases. It is as follows:

"It is hereby ordered that the inmates of the county poor house shall perform such work as they are directed to do by the superintendent, M. M. Cushing, when certified by the physician that they are able to perform manual labor, and that upon their refusal to do and perform such work as directed by the said M. M. Cushing, he is hereby authorized to discharge them from the said poor house, and his judgment shall be final in respect thereto."


