WASHINGTON, July 15 .- J. H. Turner, secretary of the inational committee of the People's party, has issued a statement to the public. It says:

"The result of the late national Democratic convention is undoubtedly a triumph of Populism. A large portion of the voters in the Populist party in the South and West were originally Democrats, and left the old party because it was dominated in every convention by the eastern Democrats who represented Wall street and the monopolists of New York and New England. The Democratic party has purged itself, reorganized itself and come out for true Democracy, and to all intents and purposes, substituted the Populist platform for the old platforms that the party has been using for years and which were dietated bugs of the East.

"Bryan, the nominee of that convention, is a man who fits the platform, tion, and the editorials based on it For more than two years he has acted with the Populists of his state. "No political issue is involved in the coming election. The question to be decided is far deeper and more vital. The perpetuity of Republican institutions has been threatened, and every loyal citizen should allay himselt against the forces which controlled the Chicago convention, forces of lawlessness which are inconsistent with the maintenance of the republic. Henceforth there should be no Republicans, no Democrats, but a union of loval citizens against the combined forces of repudiation and disorder. When once this dangerous element has been stamped out at the polls by an indignant people, we can again divide and discuss these political questions, which for generations have kept alive the two political parties."
