GENERAL YNCLAN WAS CAPTURED

Government Soldiers Were Drawn Into a Trap and Fired on From All Sides.

KEY WEST, July 18 .- The Spaniards under General Suarez Ynclan have suetained a crushing defeat at the hands of the insurgents under Antonio Maceo. Not only was Ynclan's column defeated with heavy loss, but it is currently reported in Havana that the Spanish general himself was captured and is now held a prisoner by Maceo.

The battle is said to have occurred on July 15, near Maceo's stronghold, in Pinar del Rio. For the last two weeks the rebels have been very aggressive, and small parties have repeatedly atmuch annoyance.
