PROCLAMATION.

Protection of Timber and Other Property From Fire.

The following proclamation was received by Sheriff Driver, who says that he shall make special effort to enforce the law :

WHEREAS, An Act passed by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon at its seventeenth regular session, entitled, "An Act to Protect Timber and other Property from Fire," contains the following:

SECTION 1. If any person shall maliclously, with intent to injure any other person, by himself or any other person, kindle a fire on his ownsland or the land of any other person, and by means of Grants, was a passenger this afternoon such fire the buildings, fences, crops, or other personal property or wooded timbewlands of any other person shall be destroyed or injured, he shall, on con-

SEC. 6. It is is hereby made the duty of the governor of this state to issue a proclamation on the first day of July of each year, calling public attention attention to the provisions of this act and warning all persons against violating the same. It is also the duty of each circuit judge of this state to read the provisions of this act to each grand jury when charging them as to their duties.

Now, therefore, I, Wm. P. Lord, governor of the state of Oregon, do hereby direct the attention of the public to the crimes and misdemeanors declared in this act, with the penalties perscribed, and warn all persons to abstain from violating all or any of its provisions. Done at the capitol, in Salem, Oregon, this first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninetv-six.




